Yuan is a legendary Chinese chef living in Berlin. With him we wanted to bring a „Joyful culture“ into the space, a lively, hot atmosphere that is a reflection of the Eastern food philosophy. „Have you eaten?“ is an authentic Chinese way of saying hello, but only to acquaintances. Eating is more than just filling the stomach; it is emotionally satisfying, secure, like being immersed in the warmth of a mother's womb. This sense of security makes everything feel safe and the world worthwhile. Food is not just a joyful feeling either, it is sometimes accompanied by tears, spicy, tears that may leave a deeper impression when stirred with the food and sent into the mouth.

In this performance we will sit in a circle, cross-legged on the floor to prepare the ingredients for yuan's cooking, which yuan will cook at the meantime. Forming a makeshift family in a safe space: what you eat is not so important, who you eat with is. When we visit our best friend's house, cooking and eating collectively often brings a powerful empathy to understanding the family philosophy behind the food.

Food can be sourced from leftover from the supermarket that day, or perhaps from a magical find in someone's fridge, we encourage you to bring some ingredients to share together and get creative with leftovers to invent heartwarming, storytelling delights.

„Chinese Weave“ is a cinematic essay by the researching and filming artist and fashion designer Regine Steenbock, who spent more than 13 months in southern China between 2016 – 2018, where she intensively studied the textile language and hybrid clothing practices of the Chinese Miao minority. Clothing serves this community – originally instead of a written language – as a central medium of internal historical transmission. With a physically moving camera, „Chinese Weave“ places itself in the midst of the social interactions associated with this practice and involves the viewer in a visual decoding process through detailed observations and precise cinematic montage.
